## χ(q) Calculation from Tight-Binding Energy Band Calculation

**q**-Dependent susceptibility  $\chi(q)$  is calculated on the basis of energy band E(k).

$$\chi(q) = g^2 \mu B^2 / 2V \Sigma n_k (1 - n_{k+q}) / (E(k+q) - E(k)).$$

The computer gives  $\chi(q)/g^2\mu B^2$ , which has the same dimension (states/eV) as the density of states. ## **Test Data**

The supplied input files are for  $\lambda$ -(BETS)<sub>2</sub>FeCl<sub>4</sub>.

(1) Download tbmap.kai.dat and the kai executable program suitable for your computer.

(2) Change the filenamd tbmap.kai.dat to tbmap.dat.

(2) Run kai. This program generates tbmap.out, tbmap.gra, and tbmap.kai. Open tbmap.out and check the calculation is OK.

(3) Run gnuplot to draw  $\chi(q)$ . The following is the example of the procedure. set parametric view 40,120,,2.0 splot "tbmap.kai" with lines set terminal postscript set output "tbmap.kai.ps" replot quit
